

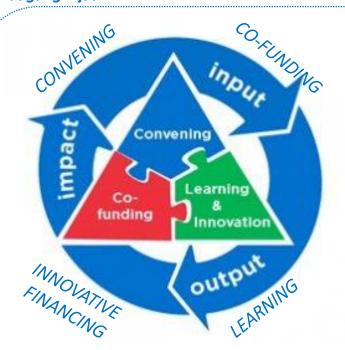

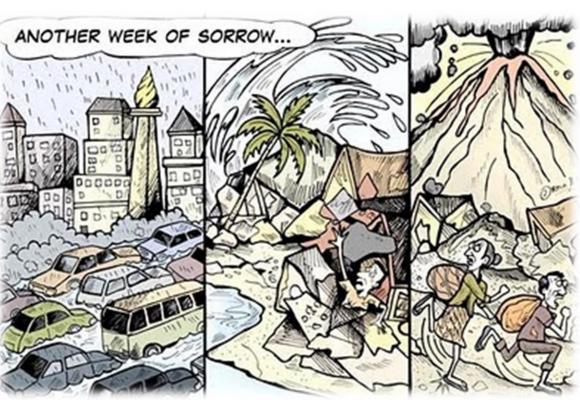

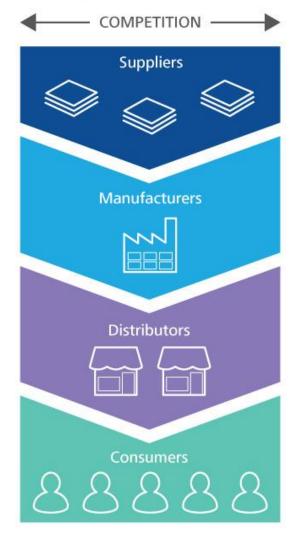

Figure 1: Supply chains evolve into value webs

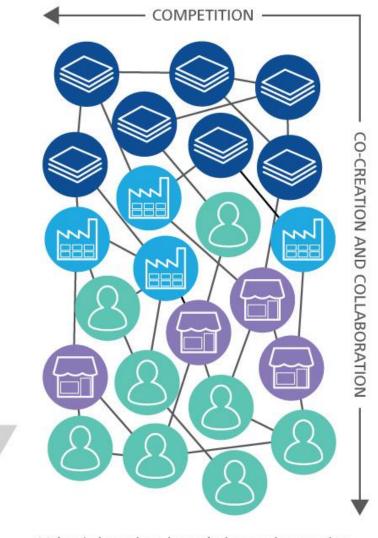
Linear supply chains are evolving into...

complex, dynamic, and connected value webs

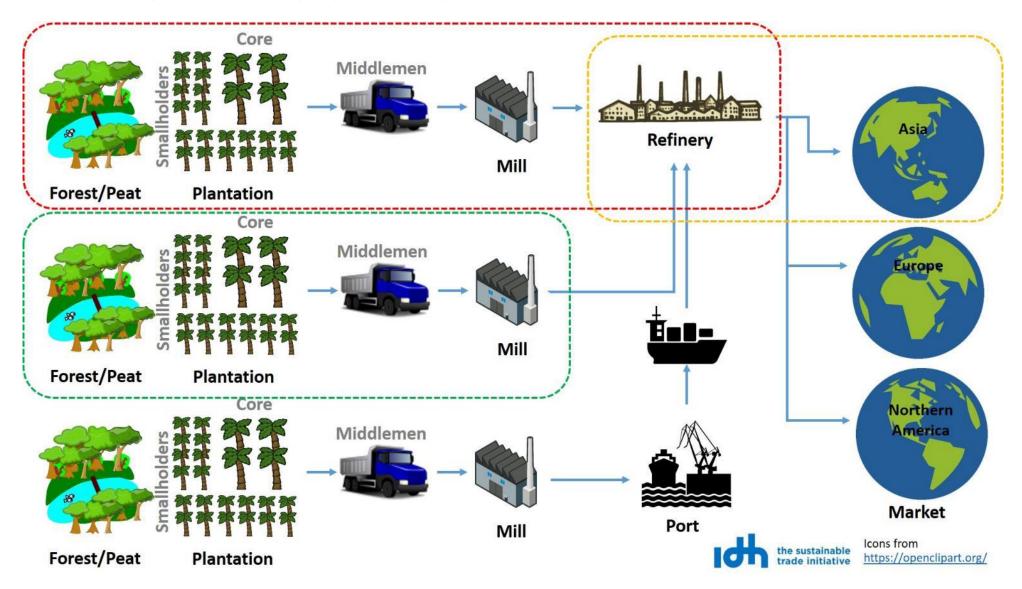


Value is based on knowledge exchange that drives proactive production of goods and services

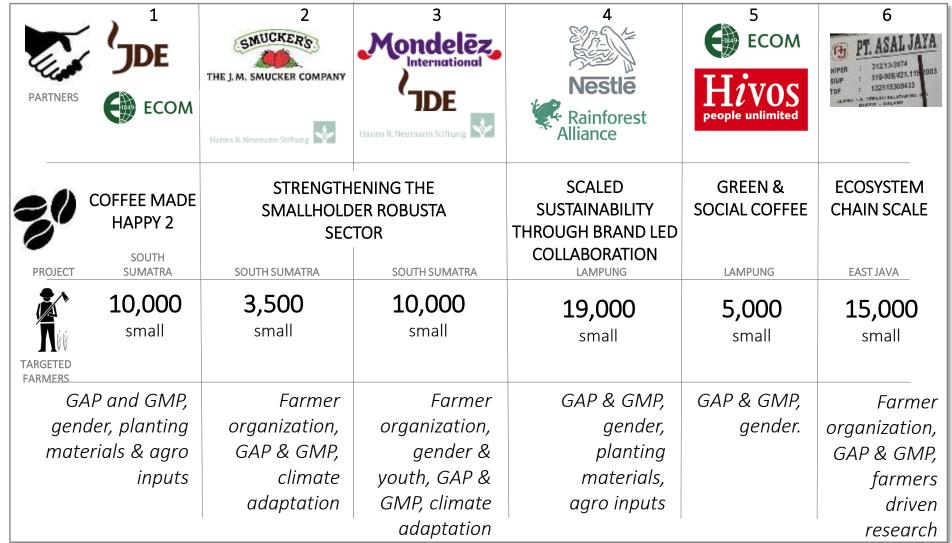

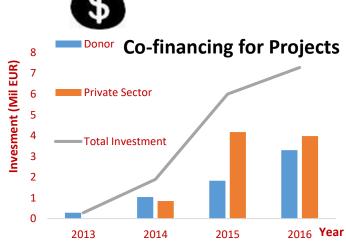

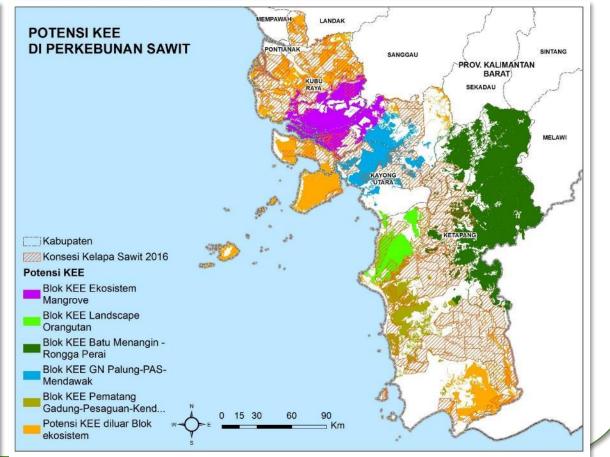

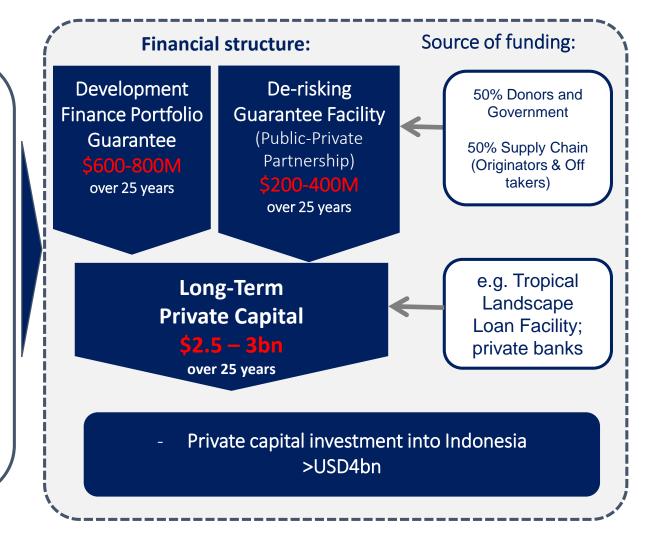
Innovative financing



Upscaling: landscape & productionprotection finance structuring

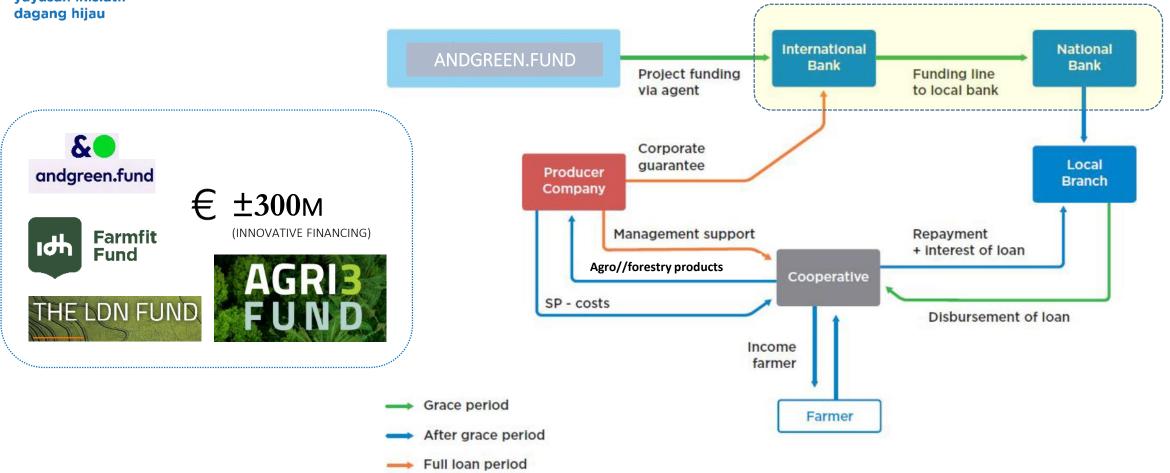
- Total projected financing need for complete rehabilitation & replanting key commodities ± <u>US\$</u>
 4billion
- Risk-layering critical to attract long-term private capital needed
- Strong protection components

KEY FOR SCALE: supply chain companies, government of Indonesia and donors must de-risk 3rd party financing
